Why is OPAL opposed to a dump in Oxford?

OPAL recognizes that dumps have multiple negative impacts on the human, social and natural environment. "Promoting public awareness of the negative impacts of opening a proposed landfill in Oxford County, Ontario" is a key purpose of our organization. Since, however, the environment is not contained by human-made boundaries, OPAL is also aware that the effects of dumps extend broadly.

Londoners, look out!


OPAL knows that Ontario recognizes the importance of ground and other drinking water sources through a suite of regulations and legislation. This is as it should be. Further, Ontario's Conservation Authorities identify and map source water protection zones. Oxford County's aquifer is officially "highly

vulnerable", and needs the protection that would be created by rapid and stringent application of regulations, actions and programs which would keep waste products away from water. Local farmers would advise you to "keep the outhouse away from the well". Ontario also is well aware that dump liners leak. The sad example of the Richmond dump where plumes of pollution have

invaded the water table well beyond the "containment attenuation zone" is proof that the dump liners leak. In fact, the very concept of containment attenuation zones around dumps are an admission that liners will leak.

All Oxford citizens need to tell the Minister of the Environment, Mr. Glen Murray, that he

should move forward quickly on the "Waste-Free Ontario Strategy" which would rid Oxford of the menace of being Ontario's largest garbage dump. Tell him so, via his email.



All this clean water is already at risk. Why risk more chances of pollution from garbage?

This article represents a small portion of OPAL's analysis of the Waste-Free Ontario Strategy where OPAL insists that a Waste-Free Ontario does not mean 17 million tonnes or more of Toronto's trash

(or anyone else's for that matter) should be trucked into Oxford and chucked into a quarry by the Thames River. See more on-line.

Are we there yet? – No, a Waste-Free Ontario could start soon. The Ministry estimates 20 years before we need to be 100% Waste-Free.
